**Tim Gorringe** worked in parishes for six years before going to South India to teach theology at the Tamil Nadu Theological Seminary, where he worked for seven years. His links with India remain close. On return to Britain he was for nine years Chaplain, Fellow and Tutor in Theology at St John's College, Oxford. In 1995 he moved to St Andrew's, and in 1998 he took up his present post as Professor of Theological Studies at the University of Exeter.

Aside from theology he is a bee-keeper, poultry-keeper, theatre-goer, home wine-maker, political activist, poetry lover and a member of the Iona Community.

with organic ice-cream *or* vegan ice-cream

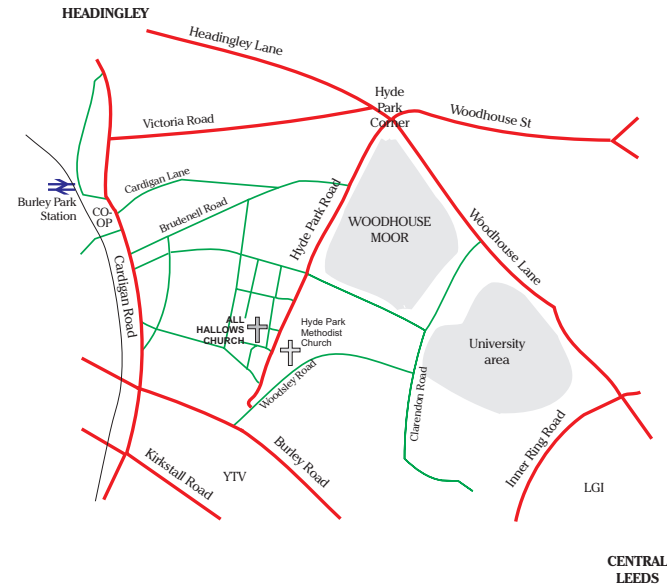


Fair-trade tea *or* fair-trade filter coffee *or* a choice of herbal teas
